#### 7. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- Staff is working with COHOTA's leadership on the transition to the new private hangar leases. This will include a hangar inspection and staff will test the transition process with some of COHOTA's board members starting this month and hope to start the process with the rest of the members in October. The transition of all 220 leases will run through June 2023.
- The FAA has approved GAMI unleaded fuel for all piston airplanes in the fleet. There is a transition period to get this into the system, but one FBO at Oxnard and one in Camarillo are working on bringing in unleaded fuel to the two airports as soon as they can.
- The security camera system contract is in place and staff expect to have installation wrapped up by the end of the year.
- The Airport's Communications and Engagement Manager has been hired and her name is Jannette Jauregui. She will be attending the Noise Forum and kicking off the noise program and the Airport's social media. The Fly Friendly Program is set to kick off tomorrow at Oxnard Airport and 35 flight schools who use Oxnard on a regular basis have been invited.
- Director Keith Freitas presented an overview of the airports and talked about the noise program at the September 6<sup>th</sup> Oxnard City Council meeting.
- The Part 150 noise compatibility studies have been approved for both airports. Each study is about \$800,000 and will be an analysis on noise impacts and what things can be done to be better neighbors.
- The Wings Over Camarillo Air Show on August 20<sup>th</sup> was a success with a record 20,000 attendees.
- The Cloud Nine project continues to move forward, consisting of four 25,000 square foot hangars and some office space for corporate private aircraft.

- Recognition of the Coulson fire helicopter which was based at Oxnard Airport for a period of time. The helicopter supported by Southern California Edison arrived in June and will stay on watch to protect Ventura County through December.
- EAA Chapter 723 was recognized for 30 consecutive years of doing the young eagles program. The program offers free rides with costs supplemented by the pilots for ages 8 to 17 to try to get folks interested in aviation.
- County CEO's office and General Services has been working with the Airport and has selected Oxnard Airport for six electric vehicle charging stations that will go in place in the next few months.
- Staff will be sending out to each of the members a request to confirm their residency and update contact information. It will be a flyer or form to confirm that the primary residency is still where they were selected by their elected official, that it's still consistent and there haven't been any changes.

#### **Recommendation:**

#### Fiscal/Mandates Impact:

There are no fiscal impacts associated with this action.

#### Discussion:

In the time that has elapsed since your September 12, 2022 meeting, COVID hospitalization rates have declined slightly with corresponding decreases in case and positivity rates in Ventura County. Public Health continues to monitor conditions and masks are recommended to be worn indoors by the California Department of Public Health. The public health situation remains stable, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") indicated that the community transmission level remains "low" in the County. The CDC also explains that "some people and communities, such as our oldest citizens, people who are immunocompromised, and people with disabilities, are at higher risk for serious illness and face challenging decisions navigating a world with COVID-19." Staff will report back to your Commission as we enter the fall/winter months.

#### Background:

Governor Gavin Newsom signed Assembly Bill 361 ("AB 361") into law on September 16, 2021. AB 361 is an urgency measure effective immediately that authorizes legislative bodies to meet remotely in any of three circumstances, as set forth in Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e):

- "The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency, and state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing." (Gov. Code, § 54953(e)(1)(A).)
- "The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees." (Gov. Code, § 54953(e)(1)(B).)
- "The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and has determined, by majority vote, pursuant to subparagraph (B), that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees." (Gov. Code, § 54953(e)(1)(C).)

Governor Newsom declared a State of Emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic on March 4, 2020. Dr. Robert Levin, Ventura County Health Officer, issued a recommendation regarding social distancing and continued remote meetings of legislative bodies on November 15, 2021 (Exhibit 2). Dr. Levin's recommendation states in part, "I continue to recommend that physical/social distancing measures be practiced throughout our Ventura County communities to minimize the spread of COVID-19, including at meetings of the Board of Supervisors and meetings of other legislative bodies in the County of Ventura." The Governor's Proclamation of State of Emergency and Dr. Levin's recommendation remain in place.

Airport staff ensures that all virtual meetings are held in compliance with the Government Code as it relates to posting requirements, public accessibility to the meeting, and public comments. Although your Commission, as a legislative body in the County, may continue to meet virtually, to do so, your Commission must now make the following findings by majority vote every 30 days, or until the Commission's next regularly scheduled meeting:

- Your Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency, and
- One or both of the following circumstances exist:
  - The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of your Commission's members to meet safely in person, or
  - State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing. (Gov. Code, § 54953(e)(3).)

Attached for consideration is Resolution #15, that if adopted, authorizes your Commission to meet remotely for a 30-day period, or until the Commission's next regularly scheduled meeting.

# RESOLUTION #15 OF THE AVIATION ADVISORY COMMISSION AUTHORIZING CONTINUED REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE AVIATION ADVISORY COMMISSION PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953, SUBDIVISION (e), OF THE RALPH M. BROWN ACT

**WHEREAS**, the County of Ventura ("County") is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Aviation Advisory Commission ("Commission");

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e), of the Brown Act, authorizes the legislative body of a local agency to use remote teleconferencing in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953, subdivision (b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions;

WHEREAS, a required condition is that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558:

**WHEREAS**, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing;

WHEREAS, such conditions now exist in Ventura County, specifically, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic on March 4, 2020 ("State of Emergency");

WHEREAS, on September 21, 2021 and November 15, 2021, Dr. Robert Levin, Ventura County Health Officer, issued recommendations to continue practicing social distancing measures throughout Ventura County communities, including to continue to implement 100 percent remote meetings of all legislative bodies in Ventura County, to prevent and minimize the spread of COVID-19 ("Recommendation to Promote Social Distancing");

WHEREAS, on October 4, 2021, November 1, 2021, November 15, 2021, December 6, 2021, January 3, 2022, January 31, 2022, February 7, 2022, March 7, 2022, April 4, 2022, May 2, 2022, May 23, 2022, June 6, 2022, July 11, 2022, and September 12, 2022, the Commission considered the circumstances of the State of Emergency and Dr. Levin's Recommendation to Promote Social Distancing and resolved to continue remote teleconference meetings for thirty days, or until the Commission's next regularly scheduled meeting;

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") indicate that the community transmission level is "low," the CDC also explains that "some people and communities, such as our oldest citizens, people who are immunocompromised, and people with disabilities, are at higher risk for serious illness and face challenging decisions navigating a world with COVID-19";



WHEREAS, the Commission does hereby find that it has reconsidered the circumstances of the State of Emergency, the State of Emergency remains active and continues to directly impact the ability of its members and attendees to meet safely in person, and that the Ventura County Health Officer, Dr. Robert Levin, continues to recommend measures to promote social distancing to minimize the spread of COVID-19 including that all legislative bodies in Ventura County continue to meet remotely, as further explained in his Recommendation to Promote Social Distancing, which has not been rescinded and remains in effect;

WHEREAS, the Commission does hereby find that it shall conduct its meetings without compliance with Government Code section 54953, subdivision (b)(3), as authorized by subdivision (e), of Government Code section 54953, and that the Commission shall comply with the requirements set forth in Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e)(2); and


#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Commission as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. Staff supporting the Commission are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including conducting open and public meetings of the Commission in accordance with Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e), and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Recommendation regarding Social Distancing and Continued Remote Meetings of

**Legislative Bodies** 

I continue to recommend that physical/social distancing measures be practiced throughout our Ventura County communities to minimize the spread of COVID-19, including at meetings of the Board of Supervisors and meetings of other legislative bodies in the County of Ventura.

The California Department of Public Health ("CDPH") and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") caution that the Delta variant of COVID-19, currently the dominant strain of COVID-19 in the country, is more transmissible than prior variants of the virus, may cause more severe illness, and that even fully vaccinated individuals can spread the virus to others resulting in rapid and alarming rates COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/variants/delta-variant.html). While the Delta variant is the currently circulating variant, the Delta-2 variant, its likely successor, is 10 to 15% more transmissible. Current case and hospitalization rates have remained stubbornly higher than they were in the days leading up to the most recent surge. In some counties in our state, these rates are starting to climb again. We are facing the winter holidays and the opportunities these holidays present to promote transmission of COVID-19 infection. The winter season and its associated cold weather drives people indoors and provides another opportunity to spread the highly transmissible COVID-19 virus. Associated with these events last year our county experienced a surge in COVID-19 cases.

Whether vaccinated or not, positive individuals are contracting the Delta variant and infecting others in our communities. Social distancing and masking are crucial mitigation measures to prevent the disease's spread. Remote meetings of legislative bodies in the County, including but not limited to the Board of Supervisors are a recommended form of social distancing that allows for the participation of the community, county staff, presenters, and legislative body members in a safe environment, with no risk of contagion. It is recommended that legislative bodies in the County continue to implement 100% remote meetings. Just as it is likely that the current County order requiring the use of face coverings indoors will be in place beyond the first of the year,

#### **Discussion:**

The existing sewer infrastructure at the Camarillo Airport currently discharges to the Camarillo Sanitary District (District) but is operated and maintained by the Ventura County Public Works Agency. Sewer flows generated at the Camarillo Airport are discharged into the District's sewer infrastructure, which is then treated by the Camarillo Water Reclamation Plant. The District and the County are working towards the annexation of the Camarillo Airport to the District at some point in the future.

In 2017, the Board approved an Out of Agency Service Agreement (Agreement) which allowed the District to directly serve the northeast hangar development area at Camarillo Airport. The sewer service for the development would ordinarily have connected to the existing Camarillo Airport sewer, but because connecting to the District's sewer system would be more efficient than connecting to the airport's sewer at that location, staff requested to instead have the property on which the development would be built receive sewer services directly from the District, subject to the terms and conditions of the attached Agreement (Exhibit 2) and the rates and charges as established by the District from time to time. Out- of-district sewer rates are typically higher than standard rates.

Under the Agreement, the District agreed to use its best efforts to obtain approval from the Ventura Local Agency Formation Commission of the annexation of the northeast hangar development property within five years, and the County agreed to cooperate with the District in its efforts to annex to the District all property containing the Camarillo Airport's sewer system within the same timeframe.

Since execution of the original Agreement, County Sanitation and the District have worked to identify a framework for possible transfer of the system. With the onset of COVID and ongoing District and County staffing shortages, progress has slowed. Additionally, an obstacle has been the funding needed to improve the existing sanitary system to District standards. The District will also need sufficient time to evaluate the condition of the sanitary system at the airport to consider whether the District is willing or able to take over the wastewater system at the airport property in addition to the northeast hangar development area and determine if it is necessary to set-up a separate fee structure for airport customers. Therefore, we wish to pursue an amendment to the Agreement to allow for a five-year extension. The Board is also being asked to authorize the Director of Airports or the Director's designee to sign future amendments to extend the Agreement, should that become necessary.

The County of Ventura (County/Applicant), and the Camarillo Sanitary District, a sanitary district (District), enter into this agreement (Amendment No. 1) to amend the existing agreement (Agreement) between them, entered into on April 13, 2017, for out of district sewer services and annexation at the Camarillo Airport.

County and District desire to amend the terms of the Agreement to allow for additional time to improve the existing sanitary system to District standards.

NOW THEREFORE, County/Applicant and District agree as follows:

- 1. All terms of the existing Agreement remain in full force and effect except as expressly modified by this Amendment No. 1.
- The following modifications are made to the Agreement:
  - a. Section 2, Scope of Service, in the second paragraph, the first sentence is modified to read:

"District agrees to use its best efforts to obtain approval of the annexation of Applicant's Property to the District if and when eligible, but within no more than 10 years from the Effective Date of this Agreement."

AGREEMENT AFFECTING REAL PROPERTY REGARDING OUT OF DISTRICT SERVICE AND ANNEXATION

PROJECT: COUNTY OF VENTURA DEPARTMENT OF AIRPORTS, NORTHEAST HANGAR DEVELOPMENT SEWER CONNECTION

This Agreement Affecting Real Property Regarding Out of District Service and Annexation (Agreement) is between the Camarillo Sanitary District, a sanitary district (District), and the County of Ventura (Applicant).

The parties agree as follows:

Section 1. Recitals.

This Agreement is made and entered into with respect to the following facts:

- A. District provides sanitary sewer services to real property located within the boundaries of the District, and to certain properties, upon request, located outside of the boundaries of the District, but in the immediate proximity thereto.
- B. The existing sewer infrastructure at the Camarillo Airport currently discharges to the District but is operated and maintained by the Ventura County Public Works Agency. Sewer flows generated at the Camarillo Airport are discharged into the District's sewer infrastructure, which is then treated by the Camarillo Water Reclamation Plant. The District and the Applicant are considering the annexation of the Camarillo Airport to the District at some point in the future.
- C. Applicant is the owner of certain real property commonly known as the Northeast Hangar Development (Project) at the Camarillo Airport located outside of the District, and lies on Assessor Parcel Numbers 230-0-030-22 and 230-0-030-24, which is shown on Exhibits A and B, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (Property). The Project would consist of: eight rows of hangars which would be owned and operated by the Applicant, up to four hangars owned and operated as part of a private commercial development effort. The Property lies outside the boundaries of

the District and would ordinarily connect to the existing Camarillo Airport sewer system. But, because connecting to the District's sewer system would be more efficient than connecting to the airport's sewer, Applicant has requested to instead have the Property receive sewer services directly from District, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the rates and charges as established by the District from time to time.

- D. District's rates for such sewer services are set by District from time to time based upon the cost of operation of the District, its facilities and on costs resulting from charges made for the cost of financing of certain District's facilities.
- E. The "Out of District" service rates from sewer service provided by District at the request of property owners for properties located outside of the District are established at different levels so as to provide for an equitable recovery of costs incurred by the District which are, or have been paid, in part, by property taxes levied by the District.
- F. District is agreeable to providing sewer services to Applicant's Property under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

#### Section 2. Scope of Service.

District agrees that Applicant may construct one main sewer connection to the Property between manholes F13-101 and F13-107 in sewer line F13-1009 or between manholes F13-100 and F13-106 in sewer line F13-1006 or connect directly to manhole F13-107, located under Las Posas Rd. The sewer service provided by the District will accommodate the following uses by the Project: restrooms associated with the Applicant's portion of the Project, and restrooms, showers, kitchenettes, and mop sinks for the portion of the private development effort.

District agrees to use its best efforts to obtain approval of the annexation of Applicant's Property to the District if and when eligible, but within no more than five (5) years from the Effective Date of this Agreement. During such time as sewer services are provided prior to the annexation of Applicant's Property to the District, Applicant must pay out-of-district charges for such sewer services.

The District has determined that the execution and implementation of this Agreement is required to further the public interest, convenience and necessity.

#### Section 3. Annexation of Camarillo Airport.

Applicant agrees to participate to the extent required in order to cause the future annexation of the Camarillo Airport to the District if and when feasible. Applicant will cooperate in such annexation request and procedures to the extent requested of Applicant by the District.

#### Section 4. Payment of Rates.

Applicant agrees that, after connecting the Property to the District's sewer system, Applicant must pay to the District the out-of-district sewer service rates for the Property's sewer service, until the Applicant annexes the Property to the District. After such time as the Property is

annexed, the sewer service rates for the Property will be adjusted to equal the rates charged to other similarly classified properties within the District.

Section 5. LAFCO Compliance.

District and Applicant acknowledge that this Agreement is subject to review and approval by the Ventura Local Agency Formation Commission before the Agreement becomes effective.

Section 6. Covenant Running With the Land.

The parties agree that the provisions of this Agreement confer a benefit upon the Property and the covenants contained in this Agreement are deemed to be covenants running with the Property.

Section 7. Notices.

Whenever notices are required to be given pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement, the same must be in written form and must be served upon the party to whom addressed by personal service as required in judicial proceedings, or by deposit of the same in the custody of the United States Postal Service or its lawful successor in interest, postage prepaid, addressed to the Parties as follows:

Section 8. Indemnities.

Applicant agrees to indemnify the District and its elected and appointed officers, employees and agents ("Indemnified Parties") and further agrees to hold the Indemnified Parties free and harmless from any claim, demand, or judgment for personal injury, wrongful death and/or property damage arising out of Applicant's use of its Property.

Section 9. Binding Effect.

The provisions of the Agreement will be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective heirs, assigns and successors in interest.

#### Section 10. Section Headings.

The Section headings contained in this Agreement are for convenience and identification only and will not be deemed to limit or define the contents of the Section to which they relate.

#### Section 11. No Presumption Re: Drafter.

The parties acknowledge and agree that the terms and provisions of this Agreement have been negotiated and discussed between the parties and their attorneys, and this Agreement reflects their mutual agreement regarding the same. Because of the nature of such negotiations and discussions, it would be inappropriate to deem any party to be the drafter of this Agreement, and therefore no presumption for or against validity or as to any interpretation hereof, based upon the identity of the drafter, will be applicable in interpreting or enforcing this Agreement.

#### Section 12. Assistance of Counsel.

Each party to this Agreement warrants to each other party that each party either had the assistance of counsel or had counsel available to it, in the negotiation for, and execution of, this Agreement, and all related documents; and each party has lawfully authorized the execution of this Agreement.

#### Section 13. Severability.

This Agreement is severable. If any nonmaterial provision or part hereof is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect.

#### Section 14. Modification.

This Agreement may not be modified except by written agreement of the parties.




Exhibit A - Northeast Hangar Development Project




Exhibit B - Project Location Map

Subcommittee members have met twice, once in July and again in August. The Draft Noise Report template has been developed based on input received and is now being

offered for your boards' comments. The data populated in the form for review purposes is from July 2022.

With the installation of a new flight tracking and reporting system, staff will have additional data and analytical tools that could supplement data included in this draft report. Staff will continue to work with the vendor and seek refinements to the system and provide additional updates at upcoming meetings.

Staff have also been engaged in the deployment of an array of new noise program elements:

- Hiring staff member dedicated to our noise mitigation program (Jannette Jauregui is now on board).
- Completed new Pilot Flight Guides for both airports. This task is complete and materials are being widely distributed now.
- Ongoing engagement with nearly three dozen regional flight schools and local pilots to implement new Fly Friendly VC program materials. This includes a kickoff event held at Oxnard Airport on September 13, 2022.
- Purchased and installed new aircraft flight tracking system, expected operational in next 60 days; staff training already begun.
- Secured FAA grants (\$715,000 each) to conduct Noise Compatibility Studies at both Camarillo and Oxnard Airports; public process to begin in early 2023.
- FAA approved a NO lead aviation fuel for all piston engines on September 1, 2022. They are now working on refining and distribution.

Looking ahead, engagement with all stakeholders on noise issues will be the top priority of Fly Friendly VC, especially the flight training community.

Airport construction reaches halfway mark September 03, 2022

Construction on the CloudNine private airplane hangar project is slow but steady.

The four hangars at the Camarillo Airport were initially slated for completion this summer, but that deadline has been pushed back to next spring.

"We're probably pushing about the halfway mark, if not a little further," said Nick Martino, vice president of operations for RKR Inc., the Westlake Village-based developer that proposed the project. "It's going really well. We're trying to catch up for lost time."

The \$40-million development consists of four private 25,000-squarefoot hangars that will be individually leased to corporations or airplane owners. Each hangar will have an additional 5,000 square feet of attached office and shop space.

Construction began on the 7 acres of land at the eastern end of the airport May 2021. Martino said the steel components have been built, and workers are now fabricating the surrounding office space. Plumbing has been installed, with electricity next.

Martino said the pandemic as well as tension among local officials due to the possibility of an airport master plan update were responsible for the construction delays.

"We waited for that to subside," he said.

In compliance with the 1976 agreement between county and city governments, the hangars will only be used for aircraft no more than 115,000 pounds. The largest plane that would be suitable for the facility is a Bombardier Global 7500, which is under the weight limit, Martino said.

"For a long time, CloudNine was a lightning rod for controversy," he said, adding that he is grateful the community spoke against allowing commercial airlines and large cargo planes.

Two of the hangars have been leased, and both tenants were already at the airport, he said.

"There's not going to be a big operational change," Martino said. "It's important to know we're fulfilling our promises."

Martino said he expects the development to generate about 360 to 600 flights per year on top of the 150,000 annual takeoffs and landings that the airport typically handles.

Because CloudNine will not offer services such as fuel and maintenance, Martino said, other businesses at the airport will benefit from the addition. The luxury facility will also make Camarillo more attractive to corporations that rely on business jets.

"We're really focused on giving the tenants the flexibility to run their operation their way," he said.

The project was initially expected to cost \$34 million, but Martino said that number has increased due to inflation.

"We have to pay more to get the stuff that we need and then we also have to make sure it gets here on time," he said. "We're not immune."

RKR secured funding for the hangar development and the acquisition of Channel Islands

Aviation—one of four fixed-based operators on the airfield— with the help of Nicholas Daddis, the CEO and founder of FBO Advisors and Air Capital Group.

The developer closed escrow on Channel Islands Aviation in May for an undisclosed price. Martino said he did not want the 46-year-old company to be purchased by an outsider who did not care about the community and its history.

"For me it's really, really important that Camarillo stays Camarillo," the Ventura County native said, adding that Channel Islands Aviation's contributions cannot be understated. "It allowed RKR to continue to fulfill a promise to support the greater aviation community."

Though Martino made it clear that CloudNine and Channel Islands Aviation are separate endeavors, he said they will benefit one another.

Unlike CloudNine and the three fixed-based operators that offer specialty aviation services, Channel Islands Aviation is a full-service operator, offering fuel, maintenance and a flight school.

"Channel Islands can actually offer those services a la carte to CloudNine should those users decide they need something outside of CloudNine's scope," Martino said. "That's a nice feature." You get all the benefits of a (fixed-based operator) but none of the obligations."

### Roundup: Small plane lands at Ventura's Marina Park, events to close roads, more

#### Small plane lands at Marina Park

VENTURA — A small plane landed on a jetty at Ventura's Marina Park late Friday afternoon after having engine problems, officials said.

None of the three people aboard were seriously injured and no one on the ground was hurt, said Ventura Police Department Cmdr. Ed Caliento.

The crash was reported around 4:40 p.m. along the beach south of Greenock Lane in Ventura's Pierpont neighborhood.

The single-engine plane landed on rocks at a jetty at Marina Park Beach, near the entrance to Ventura Harbor, officials said.

About 2 gallons of fuel had leaked from the plane and a minimal amount of oil had also spilled, with none of it reaching the water, according to firefighters' radio traffic.

The three people aboard the craft refused medical treatment at the scene, firefighter reports indicated.

Federal Aviation Administration information indicated the plane was a Cessna 172L Skyhawk registered to a Simi Valley owner.

The 22-foot plane had taken off from Santa Paula Airport for a recreational flight, Ventura Fire Department Battalion Chief Douglas Miser said in a release. The plane seats up to four.

The pilot had flown over Carpinteria and was headed to Ojai when the plane started to have engine problems over Highway 33, near Stanley Avenue, Miser said. After radioing air traffic control, the pilot was told to land at Oxnard Airport and brought the plane toward the coast.

The plane was gradually losing altitude and it was "inevitable" the pilot would need to make an emergency landing, Miser said. The pilot guided the craft near the water line and landed on top of the Greenock jetty.

Along with Ventura City fire and police, Ventura County fire and sheriff's personnel and harbor patrol, state lifeguards, state parks and ambulance crews responded.

Ventra police coordinated salvage efforts and crowd control. The FAA and National Transportation Safety Board will investigate.

Thank you for submitting renderings and a plan sheet for the proposed Waypoint Café north patio improvements located at the Camarillo Airport. We appreciate your patience as we reviewed your plan and drawings.

Please accept this letter as conceptual approval to demolish the existing north patio area concrete, replace it with an expanded footprint within the current leasehold, install a new patio cover and make other minor improvements, as submitted in the drawings provided to the Department of Airports (DOA) on September 8, 2022. **This letter provides approval in concept only** and does not guarantee that the improvements may be built as proposed. Further review and approval of plans by the DOA and other permitting agencies, may be necessary before the DOA provides final project approval.

This letter will allow you to submit plans to the County of Ventura, Building and Safety offices and other approving agencies. However, submission of a separate and final project review and approval letter from the DOA will be required prior to the issuance of any permits by them. The DOA has provided a list of comments/conditions below:

#### **Department of Airports Comments/Conditions:**

- The DOA is amenable to the proposed Waypoint Café north patio improvements, as long as any permit requirements for the patio cover can be met.
- The renderings reflect a double gate at the northwest corner of the patio area leading to the airfield. To ensure that the airfield remains secure, this gate shall either be eliminated or fully secured (locked) to prevent unauthorized access to the airfield.
- 3. Once the project has received final DOA approval, and a permit is issued, a set of drawings approved by the Ventura County Building and Safety Department and any other required permits must be provided to the DOA prior to construction.

- 4. A copy of the permits after being signed off must be provided to the DOA.
- 5. A set of "as built" drawings shall be provided to the DOA upon project completion.
- 6. During construction the security of the airport must not be compromised.
  Anyone driving on the airport must attend driver's training given by the Airport Operations Department or be escorted at all times.


